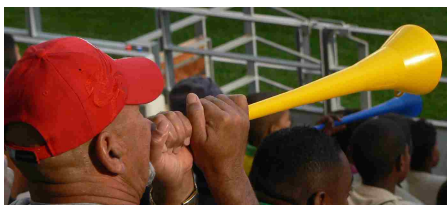

FROM THE PASTOR

Pentecost - Excitement amongst the Christian Community

There is excitement in the air! It is less than “forty days” to the first FIFA Football World Cup, hosted in South Africa. It is advertised on the streets, at airports, on radio and TV. The vuvuzellas are blowing (you can't hear much else). South Africans of all



... races and all languages flock to the new build stadiums during so called “trial runs”. They go off smoothly (I talk of experience!) The FIFA boss declares proudly: “South Africa is ready. If need to, the World Cup can start tomorrow!” Many expect positive spin-offs for the country - not only now, but also in the post-World Cup years.

Preparing for a World Cup is essential - not only the building of the stadiums, but also getting the people focussed and supporting the event (I am not even a football fan, but even I tried to get a ticket!). Without the preparation and the created hype for support an event like to World Cup could come and go almost unnoticed. . People in eMKhondo (the new name for Piet Retief - my home town) - far

removed from a major city and any a football stadium in South Africa would only have noticed a further decline of service delivery in their rural villages (no money for small towns during the World Cup preparations).

Roughly three weeks before the World Cup is **“Pentecost”**. Pentecost! Who talks about Pentecost? Some may even ask: “What is Pentecost? Pentecost has to do with “Spirit”. It is “Life-giving”. Without it there is no “hype”, no “focus” in the Christian community. In fact, without Pentecost the “Church” is dead. Maybe “only a few” will take note of Pentecost this year. Three years ago the City of Cape Town hosted their annual “Sexpo” at the Cities Convention Centre on Pentecost weekend (I, then chairman of the Ministers Fraternal, officially objected). You may even decide to stay in bed that Sunday - no expectations, no excitement. Why?

Also Pentecost needs “preparation”. God's promises concerning his Spirit were given long ago. The prophet Joel wrote: **“In those days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people... I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth below... and everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved”** (see Acts 2:17-21). **“All** people” and **“everyone”!**

These words do not describe every day reality, but the *intend* of God. Nobody was/is to be excluded. His Spirit is for all people and God wishes everyone to be saved. But the actual numbers of Spirit-recipients are few. Could the lack of “preparation” play a role? No anticipation of something to come (even within the Christian community)! No excitement on the eve of a major, divine event!

On the day of Jesus' ascension into heaven, he repeated the promise: **“You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes... and you will be my witnesses to the end of the earth”** (Acts 1:8). The disciples were “afraid” but trusted Jesus. In view of the promise given, they did two things: (1) “They stayed continually at the temple, praising God” (Lk.24:53), and (2) “They went upstairs to the room” (Acts 1:13) - where they spent time in fellowship and prayer.

Then it happened. Not everybody in the greater Jerusalem noticed it. But those waiting for God's promise were touched by the Spirit of God. There were no vuvuzellas, but **“a sound like a violent wind”** and something

that seemed to them as **“tongues of fire”** settling on each of them.

Fire is the symbol of the Holy Spirit. Loosened tongues is what the Spirit works - “they will be my witnesses.” And indeed on that day the Gospel of Christ was heard in the native languages of all people visiting Jerusalem.

Do you need the Spirit of God in your life? Then it is time to be quiet. It is time to take that minute or two in the early morning to pray to God for his Spirit in your life. Or why not go to the praying booths set up at the *Salem Full Gospel Church* in Bothasig (C/o Adam Tas & See Streets). They are set up by the different churches in our community and will be opened all hours of the day and night (24/7) from Ascension Day (13 May) to Pentecost Day (23 May) for “Ten Days of Prayer”.

On the Day of Pentecost there was excitement in Jerusalem. It was an excitement rooted in the assurance of salvation through the death and resurrection of Jesus. This assurance energises, provides focus, balance and draws people into the fellowship of God.

I sincerely hope “Pentecost” will not just pass by unnoticed this year. Start preparations now. Pray for God's Spirit in your life, in the life of St Thomas, and all people you know. Above all pray for God's Spirit for South Africa, our beloved country, that he will keep his protective hand over all people, both

locals and visitors, celebrating the World Cup. And may this World Cup provide us with opportunities to share the Gospel and to bring glory to God.

At the church council meeting, held on 12 April, the church council accepted the quote from David Skibbe to, among other, replace the toilets in the rest rooms, tile the floors and the walls (up to a height of 1.510m), and to

repair the damaged areas in the inner courtyard of the church. The quote amounts to R22 995.00. David immediately got to work. We sincerely hope that you will all enjoy our revamped facilities.

Vestry rented out to a "Clinical Pastoral Therapist"

The church council was approached by Monika Edwards, a qualified Clinical Pastoral Therapist (B.Hons [Psychology] Unisa, M.Th [Clinical Pastoral Care] Stellenbosch) to rent the vestry in St Thomas. The church council accepted the offer made and a *Lease Agreement* has been signed. Monika will use the vestry on

Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8.30-14.00 and 17.30-19.30. We are grateful - not only for the extra income - but also for the counselling expertise of Monika.

The lease period expires on 31 December 2010 (it can be renewed).

New Sunday Service Time - 9.30am

At an official meeting of the Congregation, held on 18 April 2010, it was formally decided to change the Sunday Service time from 10.00am to **9.30am**. A Survey had shown that the great majority of St Thomas members would prefer the service to start at 9.00am. Such an early time would, however, make it impossible for

the *Anglican Catholic Church* to make use of our facilities on a Sunday morning. As a result the congregation decided on 9.30am. The change is to take place from June 2010, that is the date when the Lease Agreement is up for renewal.

Pastor Reinstorf's Schedule (May to July)

Pastor Reinstorf will be engaging on both a busy working schedule and a relaxing holiday during the next three months. From 3-5 May he will be

attending the Synodical Convention in Westville-Durban. From 1 -8 June he will be in the USA, at the Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne,

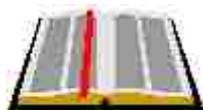
Young Youth

FROM THE TREASURER

This report covers the first quarter of our financial year, in other words, the three months ending March 2010.

Budget

The approved budget for St Thomas for 2010 is R155,000. To meet the demands of this budget we need monthly contributions amounting to R12917, which is stiff (on average about R3000 per Sunday) but nevertheless something we can manage if everybody contributes gratefully for blessings received.

Remember thank offerings can be made either on Sundays or by means of an electronic bank transfer into the account of St Thomas Congregation (see details on last page). It is all voluntarily as the Spirit of God leads you.

Income

Our experience during the past few years has been that our income, during the first three months of the year, is relatively speaking high compared to the rest of the year.

During this period our actual income normally exceeds our budgeted figure and we show a surplus. This year the pattern has changed and we experienced a shortfall during the first three

months of the year. During this period our contributions amounted to R29 547, which is R9 204 short of the budgeted figure. Fortunately it is only the beginning of the financial year and there are still three quarters left to wipe out this shortfall.

Apart from our contributions all the other income items are as budgeted. Our total income during the first three months of the year amounted to R55 947.

On the expenditure side the majority of our expenses were the normal monthly running expenses like payments to the municipality, electricity, garden service, etc. The only cost worth mentioning was that we had the altar area painted as well as the fascia boards. The total cost amounted to R2 483.

Conclusion

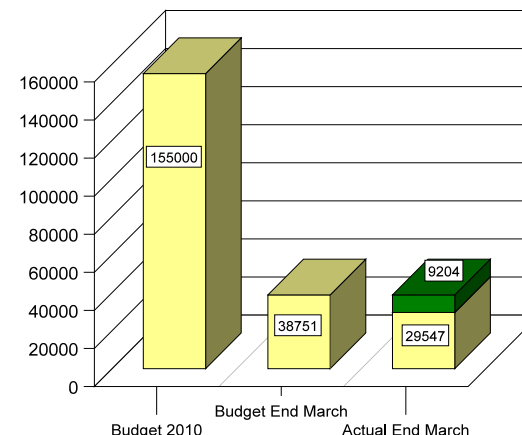
As indicated we ended the first quarter if our financial year with a shortfall of over R9 000. Lets make a special effort during the remainder of the year to change the shortfall into a surplus.

57th Synodical Convention of the FELSISA

On 4-5 May the *Free Evangelical Lutheran Synod in South Africa* (FELSISA) will be holding its 57th Synodical Convention under the theme "Works of Kindness". The theme is to remind all delegates of the life of Jesus. Invariably he was drawn to the poor and the people in need. Has the FELSISA and its congregations something to learn? God's mercy seeks expression - found in and through Jesus and continues to do so through God's people today - freed from themselves by the assurance of God's salvation.

During the last day of the Synodical Convention elections will take place. The FELSISA will elect a new president/bishop, a vice-president, and three other members to the Synodical Council (one pastor and two lay people) . Having reached the retirement age (but continuing to serve the congregation *Wittenberg*) President Ahlers handed back the presidency in December 2009.

St Thomas Congregation will be presented by Shawn Johnston. We thank Shawn for making time to attend this important meeting.

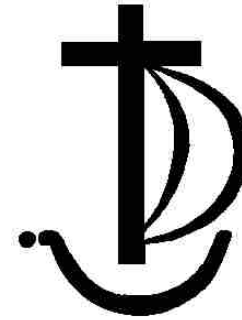
